Deeply Rooted

Reflecting Back On God's Living Presence

If you'd driven by the First Pres Courtyard one Wednesday in late May, you would have seen it filled with the joy of playing children. Five kids crowded around plates with big bubble wands making huge bubbles. Six-year-olds painting the faces of toddlers in a design that I can only describe as beautifully abstract. Kids are learning to jump rope and pretend to hula-hoop. Hula-hooping is hard! All around were parents laughing with their kids, chatting with one another, and thanking the teachers of the First Pres Day School for another year of incredible loving education where their bitties transformed into toddies

and toddies into kiddies. As a parent and as pastor, I can confidently say that the First Pres Day School is an incredible blessing to our church and community.

We've made it through another school year. Thank God. When we reach any end, we ought to stop and take a little time to reflect on what it all has meant. Reflection enables us to learn from the past, grow from mistakes,



celebrate successes, and give thanks to God for all of it. Take a few minutes to consider these questions. Bonus points if you write down your answers.

In the last year, what was your best season? Why? In the last year, what was your greatest struggle? Why? What did God do in your life this year? For what are you most grateful?

This May, our church staff went on an overnight retreat to the mountains, where we took time to reflect on our year. We did some of this individually, but we also asked some reflection questions on First Pres's ministries in the last year. Questions like: What events or ministries best created deep belonging? What events or ministries had the most impact? What events/ministries best pointed to God's real, living presence? I wonder how you might answer those questions. Send me your answers!

As we reflected, we had to ask ourselves, what kinds of things point to God's real living presence? We ended up making the following short list, "Suffering, death, birth, guilt, transition, deep belonging, children, music, silence, prayer, and creation point to God's intimate transcendence." As Pastor Josh said in a recent sermon, "You're here because you've either seen something or you want to see something." We want to see the living God make a difference in our lives and in each other's lives. Let's point to God's living

presence the more we deepen our faith as Christians. So that's our plan.

Right now, we're finishing a sermon series called 40 Days with the Holy Spirit, which will guide us in silence, prayer, and reflection of the Spirit in scripture. If you haven't bought your devotional of the same name by Jack Levison, it's not too late. Start now and let this devotional guide you through summer.

In late August, we will go on a retreat to Camp Carraway. Our retreat speakers will be Jack Levinson and his wife, Priscilla Pope-Levison, experts on the Holy Spirit and Mainline Evangelism, respectively. This retreat will connect us to God's intimate transcendence through music, play in creation, and the creation of deeper belonging. Registration is open, so reserve your spot today.

Starting with kick-off on September 15, we'll begin a sermon series on the *Lord's Prayer*. Prayer recognizes a simple but essential truth: God is God, we are not. In prayer, we reach out to the living presence of God, who is beyond us yet intimately close. In the midst of what will be a wild fall for our country, let's center ourselves in prayer.

I'm excited to reflect back on this season with you in another year and to hear about how God has deepened us all.

Sabbatical as Pilgrimage

"Your life is a journey you must travel with a deep consciousness of God." I Peter 1:18

A pilgrimage is a journey taken to a place of significance—a search for the meaning of something. In religious tradition, a pilgrimage takes us to a place where we believe we can deepen our connection to God, or it is at least a search to discover something of God's will for our lives.

Pilgrimage had been a part of the Jewish faith from the time that Abram and Sarah set out from Ur not knowing where they were going but trusting God to go with them and guide them on the way. The pilgrimage of Abram and Sarah was both a physical journey and a search for the deep meaning of God's will in their lives. Moses journeyed with the children of Israel in the wilderness, wandering pilgrims waiting for God to guide them to a homeland. Since the time of David, the children of Israel had observed the annual pilgrimage to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover and other holy days of Israel. Jesus was born into a pilgrim faith.

All of that may seem rather obvious. But it may not be so obvious that every religious holiday trip to visit family is a pilgrimage. Every time we



attend a candle-lighting service, we are on a religious journey. Every time we put on music or light a candle, longing to renew the spirit within, we are pilgrims seeking a deeper understanding of God's will for our lives.

At the heart of faith, there is something fundamental about being on a pilgrimage. Whether we are traveling to a place in order to draw closer to God or seeking to discover God's will in our lives while staying in place, our faith is a "pilgrimage faith." We are always on the pilgrim's way.

I embrace that understanding of the journey of faith as I set out on my three-month sabbatical in August. At its heart, it is about deepening my connection to God. While the itinerary is designed to explore topics around retirement, the goal is to discover something of God's will for my life as I make the transition in the next couple of years from full-time ministry to being a retired minister. The Timothy H. Waugh Children's Music Fund Created



Jesus said "I am the light of the world. Follow me." - John 8:12

As 90 children and 60 volunteers gathered nightly to seek Jesus, the verse above guided our time together at First Presbyterian's summer Vacation Bible School. This year's VBS was a curriculum from Shine, *Seekers in Sneakers*, and focused on finding Jesus through five stories about Jesus' life. We focused on Jesus the learner (Luke 2:41-52), Jesus our companion (Matthew 4:17-22), Jesus our teacher (Matthew 5:14-16, John 8:12), Jesus our example (John 13:1-17), and Jesus our helper (John 21:1-14). Children from preschool to fifth grade heard stories of Jesus' humanity and his divine example that we still seek to follow today.

The Grow in Faith team used the curriculum to create a VBS that nourished the whole child. We encouraged wonder and seeking Jesus through our high-energy opening led by Robin Fisher. She even had special guests, Shaggy (Pastor Josh) and Scooby-Doo (Steve Fisher), to help solve our clue words each evening. Robin's amazing energy and joy in leading our music set the tone for an evening of learning that would be anything but boring. Cathy Adams created an art program that encouraged creativity and happiness. The children created tie-die handkerchiefs. In the evening, we learned about servant hearts and washing feet. I like to think that Jesus would have used a colorful cloth to wash his feet had it been available. Noel Adams had delicious dinners each evening that filled our children's tummies and allowed them to spend time in fellowship with adults from our congregation who helped to serve each meal. Allison Adams kept the wiggles at bay by providing great games that encouraged teamwork and companionship. Beach ball sillies, pizza box relays, and water games are just a few of the activities our children engage in during recreation. Maggie Behrooz shared the word of God each night through storytelling with the help of some of our favorite characters and stuffed animals. 

These women are just some of the many amazing volunteers who allowed our Vacation Bible School to share the Light of Christ with the children in our community. With over one hundred children registered and averaging ninety children in attendance each night, we sought Jesus, his love, and his example within the campus of First Presbyterian. We started summer with a reminder that Jesus loves us and seeks us, and we are to follow his example. I think some Jesus, lively games, creative crafts, and the occasional popsicle are all terrific ways to remind our community that church is a place of Christ's love, God's light, and the Holy Spirit's unconventional stirrings. 

Life is Impossible and that's Good News By Nick Lannon


"No one ever said life would be easy...."

The problem is that life is impossible! Fortunately, what sounds like bad news is merely the beginning of the Good News in this concise, gospel-centered book about God's abundant mercy and love. With wisdom, humor, and compassion, Nick Lannon casts life's painful realities in the light of Jesus, the One who achieves the unachievable.



Low Anthropology By David Zahl


